Grand Masters Festival

W. Bro. Ian Kirkpatrick presented his report to the Grand Masters Council as follows:

- At this time, we have lodged approximately €120,000. The estimated total is expected to be in the region of €500,000.
- Whilst €500,000 is a substantial sum it falls short of the original aspiration of around €1,000,000.

Actions to be taken

- Reports at each Provincial Grand Lodge meeting.
- Use the website in particular the events information.
- Increase the ‘productivity’ of each team PRO to maximise exposure through publications.

Distribution of funds

- A preliminary distribution of funds raised during September to utilise publicity not only through our own channels but those of each charity.

- Although the website is not being used to best effect, it is noted that the most recent postings were provided by W. Bro. Kirkpatrick

CRM (Salesforce - Client Relationship Management System)

David Robinson, Administration and Support Manager presented an overview on the progress of the population of Salesforce.

The report identified the areas where Lodge Secretaries have not engaged, and the Provincial Grand Masters were strongly encouraged to follow up with all outstanding Lodges immediately.

It was agreed that “Leave to Install” will not be issued if the Officers elect records are not up to date.

Provincial Grand Masters were requested to ensure that a Brother being appointed to any committee that his details were up to date on Salesforce including his date of birth and email address and telephone numbers.

It was agreed that no appointment would be considered at Provincial of Grand Lodge level if this basic information is not available.

Website, Web Hosting & Social Media

Grand Lodge Website

David Robinson, Administration and Support Manager presented an overview of the Communities Area, which will shortly be launched to the Membership. Over 300 Members have applied for and been given access.

Guidance for the use of Social Media

Social media platforms have become an increasingly popular channel for communication in the 21st century. They provide ways to share content with a wide audience, and as such are tools for sharing information about Freemasonry and Masonic activities. However, as with any powerful tool, social media needs to be used with caution, as incorrect use can have a damaging impact on Freemasonry's public image, and therefore on Freemasonry itself.

The guidance applies to posts made by Freemasons on all social media platforms. The term 'post' refers to any action taken on social media, whether sharing original content, making a comment on content someone else has shared (including 'liking' Facebook posts and Tweets), or re-sharing content to one's own connections.

Education Committee

The Education Committee is now meeting regularly along with the various sub-groups in preparing a programme including documentation covering from the time an individual expresses an interest in joining Freemasonry up until he receives his Master Masons Degree. It is expected to have draft documentation available for the Cabinets consideration during the last quarter of 2020.

Grand Lodge Communications 4th June

As of 25th March, the office was closed, however all staff are working from home and have access to their emails. We anticipate that most of the administrative activities will continue as heretofore, however there may be some delays and Grand Lodge asked for our patience.

News from around the Province



Further guidance on dealing with Masonic administration during this period of Suspension.

On the 13th March, I wrote to you to confirm a General Suspension of all Masonic Activity in response to the spread of COVID-19.

This suspension will of course, create a variety of issues relating to the administration of our Lodges. This note supersedes all previous guidance on the abandonment and postponement of meetings.

Lodges meetings and the conferring of Degrees

Any Irish Order due to meet during the period of the suspension does not need to issue a summons for the meeting(s) but should place a copy of the General Suspension letter in the Minute Book where the minutes of the missed meeting(s) would be.

When the suspension ends, a further letter will be circulated informing Brethren that meetings can resume. A copy of this letter should be entered in the Minute Book and the Lodge will resume meetings in accordance with its By Laws. There will be no need to reschedule any meeting(s) which would have occurred during the period of the suspension.

If the Lodge feels there is enough of a backlog of work to require additional meeting(s) this can be dealt with as an Emergency Meeting(s) for which no Dispensation will be required.

Election of Officers and Installation meetings

Following a recent meeting of the Grand Masters Cabinet by video conference, it was agreed that all Brethren elected or appointed to office to serve for the year 2019/2020 will continue in office until the end of 2020/2021.

This will eliminate the requirement for the election of Officers for 2020/2021.

Details of how to conduct the Installation of Officers for 2021 will be issued in due course. Needless to say this directive will override any other GL Law.

This directive includes:

- Provincial Grand Lodge Officers
- Subordinate Lodge Officers
- Committees
- Boards of General Purposes



Provincial Grand Lodge Communication meetings

With regards to our Half-Yearly Communications meeting, the Provincial Grand Secretary will insert a copy of the General Suspension Letter in the Minute Book with a note stating that 'the Half Yearly Meeting of the Province on 28 March 2020 was not held owing to the General Suspension of All Masonic Activity issued by the Provincial Grand Master on 13 March 2020'.



Conferral of Honorary Rank

It is normal practice that at our Half Yearly Communications meeting, deserving Brethren of the Province, who have been considered by Grand Lodge to merit receiving Honorary Past Grand Rank, have been notified of their appointment by email and will assume their new ranks with effect from the date the Investiture meeting should have taken place.

150th Anniversary

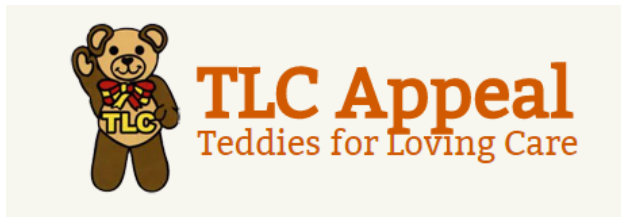
To coincide without ½ Yearly Communications, we were also planning to celebrate the 150th celebrations of the Lodge of Light.

Teddies for Loving Care



Full Steam Ahead

Almost exactly two years ago, we gave away our first trial batch of teddies in Gisborne and, shortly thereafter, officially launched in Rotorua. And, last Christmas, we placed teddies in Children's Wards throughout the North Island.

At the start of 2019, we talked with Richard Taylor, District Grand Master for the South Island, to explore ways we could work with his District and it is great to be able to report we now have a consistent programme right across New Zealand and a South Island representative on the Board of Trustees.

We organised a Teddy Tiki Tour round the South Island to make sure teddies were available in every hospital and rural emergency unit from Nelson to Invercargill.

Our teddies are now used in nearly every city and regional centre and as at 31st October 2019, we have used over

22,000

That is over 22,000 children who are sick and injured, in pain or in distress who have received a teddy bear to comfort them. We will soon need to order more teddies to keep the programme running through 2020 and beyond.
